WLLC Student Success Funds supported an undergraduate internship position to coordinate the Sin Límites Biliteracy Program at Walker Elementary in Springdale in 2024. The program is an afterschool biliteracy initiative aimed at promoting bilingualism and language maintenance among Latino elementary students. It serves as a lab for our Service-Learning courses.



## Collaborative Strategies to Improve Speaking and Presentational Skills Magnetti - D'Eugenio - Villa Ligero - Translinguistic Collaborative Award: \$1,000

### Collaborative Video Creation for Enhanced Spanish Learning

Elementary Spanish 1 & 2
Sung Hye Yang (Instructor of Spanish)

**Objective**: Enhance language skills, intercultural experiences, collaborative learning, and overall success among WLLC Spanish program students.

#### **Process:**

Three tutorial videos created by teams from the previous semester have been made available on Blackboard.

- Additionally, **a workshop** held on April 24 provided students with valuable **Q&A support** to further aid in their understanding and implementation of video creation techniques.
- **Current students work in groups** of three to create creative and self-directed outcomes using Spanish, from storyboarding to scriptwriting, acting, filming, and video editing.

Outcome: A celebratory event on May 1 allowed students to showcase their Spanish videos, fostering collaboration and active student participation. During this event, students engaged in a voting process to determine the best Spanish videos, enhancing their learning experience and encouraging further engagement with the Spanish language. A post-presentation survey to evaluate the project's effectiveness was conducted.








## The effects of visual feedback on L2 learner production of monophthong vowels in Spanish

The current study focuses on implementing visual feedback as a means of teaching L2 learners the pronunciation differences that exist between the Spanish and English in relation to vowels. In this specific case, L2 learners of Spanish (L1 English) tend to produce diphthongs in contexts where the orthography indicates monophthong production for Spanish (Morgan, 2009). In Spanish, stressed vowel /e/ and /o/ are never diphthongized, but in English, /e/ and /o/ tend to be produced as [e1] and [ou] when in the stressed position. Intermediate-mid level L2 learners from a large, public university were asked to compare their productions with those of a native speaker via spectrograms using formant movements to visualize and differentiate between target-like and non-target like productions of /e/ and /o/ by identifying whether vowels "dip" or "rise" at the end of production.










- The findings will be applied to the instruction of our Chinese program to improve the success of students learning Chinese grammar.









